University Hospital & Clinics (UHC) – is available to everyone in the community as a full-service academic community hospital, and offers a variety of clinics. UHC has the resources to treat everything from minor illnesses to major emergencies.

Q. How can UHC help me?

Our goal is to help you avoid a trip to the ER by establishing a relationship with a doctor at one of our UHC clinics. This will allow you to receive regular check-ups and better manage your healthcare. Call our hotline at (337) 261-6500 to schedule an appointment with a primary care doctor.

Q. What kind of care can I expect?

UHC trains some of the finest physicians in Acadiana. Teaching hospitals routinely provide better care, according to national studies. The same standard of care is reflected throughout the health system and you will notice this when you enter UHC.

Q. What is the difference between Lafayette General Medical Center and University Hospital & Clinics?

Each facility serves the community in a distinct role, with policies and procedures, financial screening guidelines and payment expectations that are different.

Q. What if I lack health insurance?

UHC offers a program to allow persons to receive medically necessary care at no charge when the person meets financial eligibility requirements. The financial screening policy remains the same – free or discounted care is based on your income and available resources. Financial screening will be done to determine your qualifications for the program.

Q. Are other forms of financial assistance available at UHC? Do you accept insurance?

The Patient Access Department can assist you with self-pay discount options, private insurance and acceptable payment arrangements. UHC also offers services to get you signed up with programs that can determine your eligibility for financial assistance such as Medicaid and prescription assistance.

Q. How do I get free medicine?

Some people may qualify for prescription assistance if they meet specific criteria. First, you must be a regular patient at a clinic – not the ER. From there, you can discuss qualifications with a financial counselor.

Q. What hospital services are provided at University Hospital & Clinics?

UHC offers the same services that have always been traditionally available, including:

- Adult medical/surgical services
- Intensive care
- Cardiac catheterization lab
- Gastrointestinal (GI) lab
- Minimally-invasive image-guided procedures
- Lab testing
- Radiology
- Cancer treatments
- Infusion
- Emergency medicine
